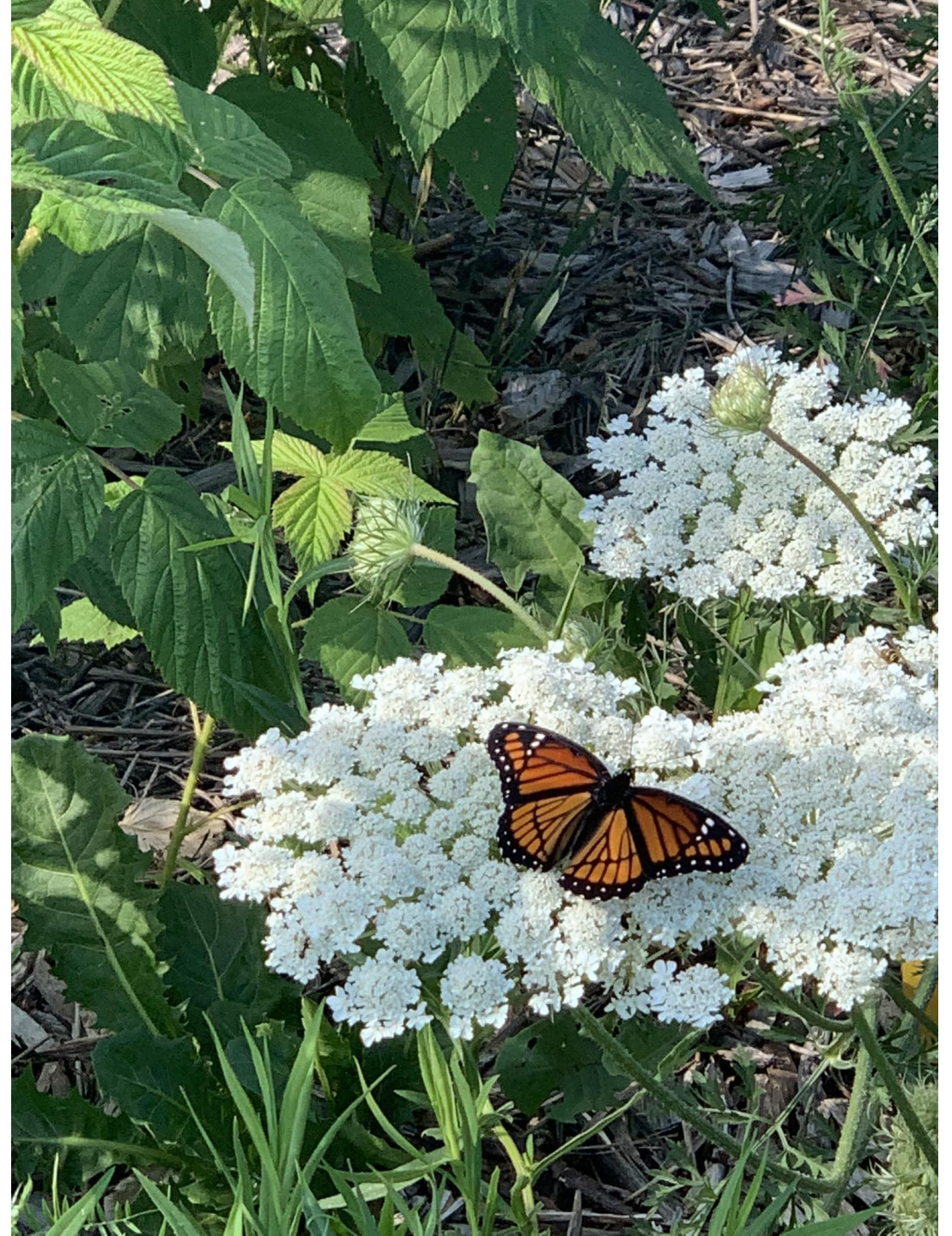

Who We Are





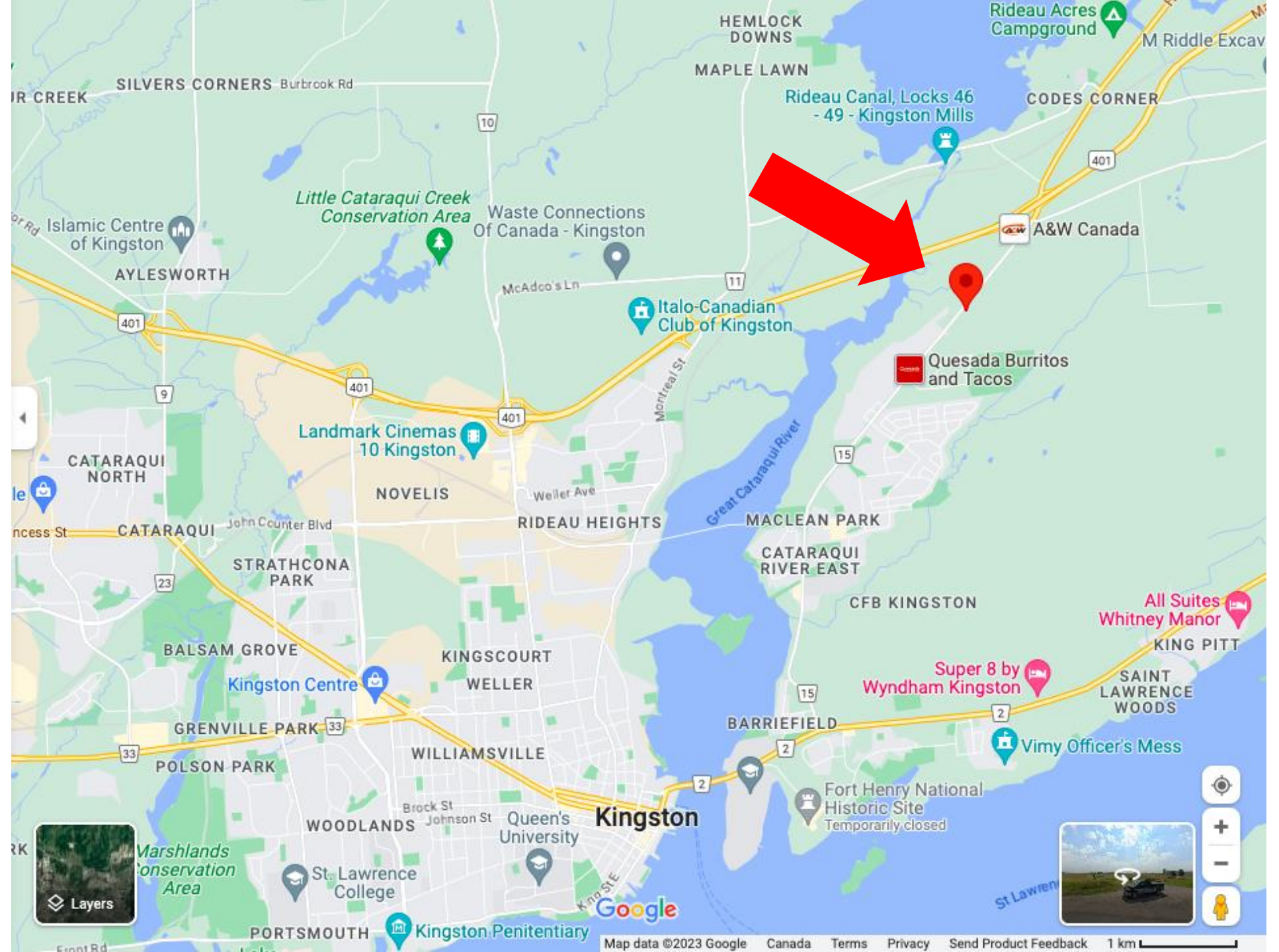
Our Mission: Support and restore diverse ecosystems within the greater Kingston area and safeguard the life of the land for the benefit of past, present, and future generations of all our relations.

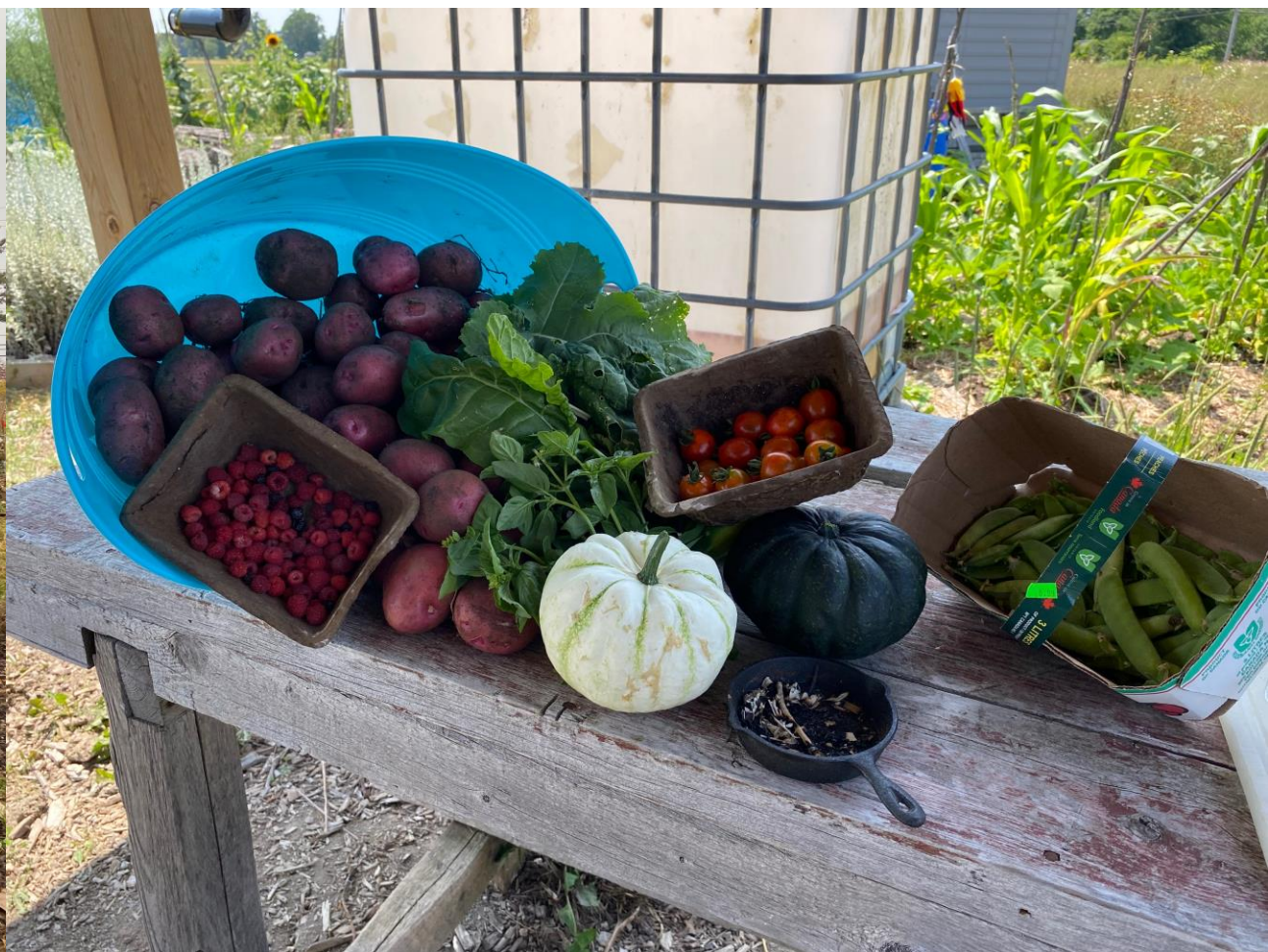
