




Becky Big Canoe is a member of the Chippewas of Georgina Island of Lake Simcoe which she refers to as Wawasagaming and the community of Georgina Island as Ashunyung. She believes that an important part of reclaiming our place is to use our original names and to assert our relationship to these lands and waters of southern Ontario. She is a founding member of Mno Aki Land Trust which is an effort to reclaim more spaces for Indigenous life and worldview via land donation to the conservation trust. Becky is an advocate for right relationship with land and water, two of the many great gifts from the Creator, on which we are to actualize our dreams, and make a livable paradise for future generations.



Canada is a vast country (9.985 million sq km) but just 0.2 percent of its total landmass is reserve land. That 0.2 percent of Canada's landmass is home to 339,595 Indigenous people (2016 Census), or 0.2% of the landmass houses 20% of the Indigenous population.






