Advocacy

- Prince Edward County advocates successfully defeated two industrial wind turbine projects in the South Shore
- Protecting fragile biodiversity from harmful development



Prince Edward County

- South of Belleville, West of Kingston, 2-hour drive from Toronto
- South Shore lies on the traditional lands of the Wendake-Nionwentsïo, Haudenosaunee and Mississauga Nations




 In 1992 Prince Edward Point was designated as an International Monarch Butterfly Reserve

 Since the mid-1970's bird migrations at Prince Edward Point have been documented by the Kingston Field Naturalists

 In 2000, Prince Edward County's South Shore and surrounding waters were designated as an Important Bird and Biodiversity Area

 There is no other location on the Canadian side of Lake Ontario where birds are known to occur in such high densities during migration







Blanding's Turtle slowly but surely wins the race

- Major migratory flyway
- At least 39 Species at Risk
- Rare and fragile Alvars
- Little Brown Bats
- \$2 million in legal fees raised by grassroots bake + yard sales, urgent pleas
























Vision: Our vision is a permanently protected Prince Edward County South Shore where together biodiversity and people thrive.























